

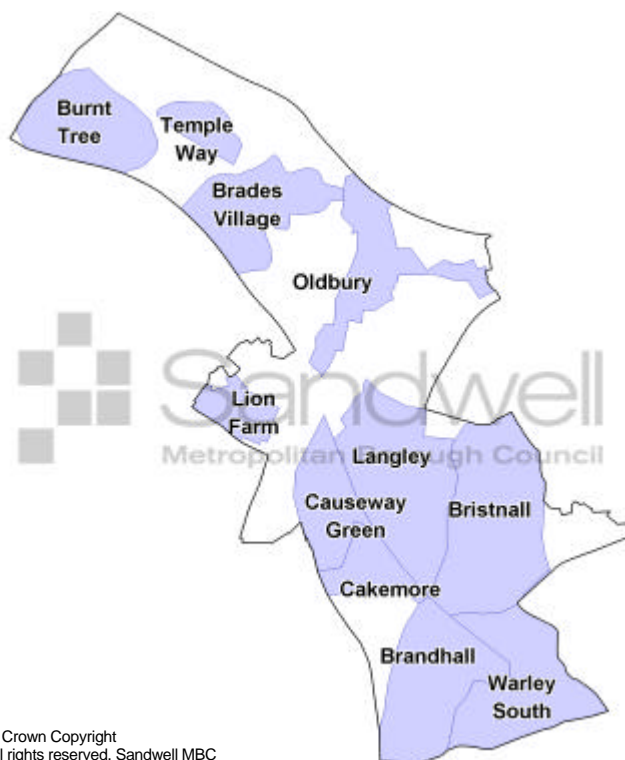

POPULATION

Oldbury has a slightly lower proportion of young people than Sandwell as a whole.

- Notable exceptions include Burnt Tree, which has a relatively high pre-school age population, and Temple Way, which has a high teenage population.
- Warley South has a relatively small proportion of young people of all ages.

ETHNICITY

Oldbury has a similar ethnic mix to the borough, with a proportionally larger white groups population and a smaller 'Other Asian' population.

- There is a notable Pakistani population in Burnt Tree, and large Indian populations in Langley and Temple Way.
- Oldbury Town's black groups population is distributed evenly across the borough.

EDUCATION

Oldbury's pupils perform well at KS2 level, but less so at GCSE.

- Pupils in Warley South outperform students in England and Wales at all levels tabled below.
- Causeway Green's pupils perform poorly at KS2 level, particularly in Maths. However they also achieved almost the best GCSE results in the borough.
- Temple Way has the highest unauthorised absenteeism rate in the town. It's pupils perform well at KS2 level, but less so at GCSE.
- Almost one in three pupils in Burnt Tree are in receipt of free school meals. They too perform well at KS2 level.

ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

Oldbury has a slightly higher percentage of economically active young people than the borough as a whole, particularly among those aged over 18.

- There are large differences in some neighbourhoods, although the actual numbers are too small to draw many conclusions.
- However Temple Way and Warley South both have higher than average proportions of Economically active young people of all ages.

HEALTH & FAMILY

Oldbury's children are referred less often than average to Social Services, but are more likely not to be in good health.

- Over 7% of children in Oldbury neighbourhood are referred to Social Services.
- Less than 17% of children in Warley South are in lone parent families. In Lion Farm, the figure is over 42%
- One child in three in Cakemore lives in a home with no central heating. In Warley South only 4% of children do.
