


# **OLDBURY**

2011 Census The Town Profiles aim to provide an overview of the socioeconomic conditions within each of the six towns of Sandwell, and their constituent wards.

# Population Change & Structure

Since 2001, Sandwell's population has increased by 8.9%. However, there has been a large variation by ward, and whilst most wards have seen an increase in population, some have seen a fall.

- The rise in population in Oldbury town mirrors that of Sandwell, and all wards within the town have seen an increase. However there has been a disproportionate increase in Oldbury ward (+25.0%), whilst Old Warley has seen little overall increase (+0.7%).
- The overall population rise in Oldbury is the second largest of all Sandwell wards between 2001 and 2011.

In terms of broad age groups, Oldbury town has seen an increase in under 20s and 20-64 year olds between 2001 and 2011 (+9.6% and +12.1% respectively), however there has been a fall in the proportion of those aged 65 & over in the town (-2.3%).

- Oldbury ward has seen a particularly large increase in the younger age groups, with a 27.0% increase in the proportion aged under 20, and a 28.7% increase in the number aged 20-64 (the second largest increase of all Sandwell wards for both of these age groups).
- Oldbury is the only ward within the town to have seen an increase in the proportion aged 65 & over since 2001, with a rise of 4.8%.
- Old Warley and Langley have both seen relatively large falls in the proportion of the population aged 65 & over since 2001, and rank fourth and fifth of all Sandwell wards on this indicator.

Oldbury town has a total population of 50,641 in 2011, and makes up 16.4% of Sandwell's total population - the same proportion as in 2001. Of the four wards which comprise the town, the largest is Oldbury ward, with 13,606 residents.

• This makes Oldbury ward the fifth most populous in Sandwell, whilst Old Warley is the borough's fifth smallest in terms of population.

The population profile of the town in terms of age structure is very similar to Sandwell overall. However, when considering the wards that make up the town, there is some variation.

- Bristnall has a smaller proportion of 25-44 year olds than average (26.1% compared with 28.1% for the town).
- The age profile of Langley is similar to the town overall.
- The structure of Oldbury ward is markedly different to that of the town. Oldbury has a larger proportion of residents aged under 16 and 25-44 (22.4% and 33.4% respectively), and a smaller proportion of those in the three older age groups. The largest difference is in those aged 60-74 10.3% of residents in the ward are part of this age group, compared with 13.4% in the town.
- Old Warley has an older age profile than the town overall, with higher proportions in the 45-59, 60-74 and 75+ age groups (19.7%, 15.4% and 10.2% respectively compared with 18.5%, 13.4% and 7.7%). In contrast, the proportion aged 25-44 is much lower than the Oldbury town average.

# Household Characteristics

Since 2001, Sandwell overall has seen an increase of 5.3% in the number of households, compared with 6.0% in Oldbury town. Within the town, Oldbury ward has seen the largest increase at 18.2%.

Considering household composition, the profile of Oldbury town is fairly similar to that of Sandwell overall, however there is some variation by ward.

• Langley and Oldbury have a large proportion of single person households (nonpensioners) compared with the town overall. These wards are within the top 5 in Sandwell on this indicator - Oldbury having the second highest proportion of all wards, and Langley the fifth.

- At 16.6%, Old Warley has a high proportion of lone pensioner households the largest of all Sandwell wards, whilst Oldbury has the lowest proportion in the Borough.
- Couple households (both married and co-habiting) are more prevalent in Bristnall and Oldbury (42.1% and 41.4% compared with 40.3% in Oldbury town).
- Most of the Oldbury Wards have a similar proportion of lone parents (with dependent children) to the town overall, with the exception of Old Warley which has a lower than average proportion of households within this category (7.4% compared with 8.6%). This is the third lowest of the Sandwell wards.
- At 5.9%, Bristnall has the highest proportion of Sandwell wards in terms of lone parents (with non-dependent children only).
- Old Warley has a higher proportion of 'all other households' than Oldbury town. This includes households made up of unrelated adults or more than one family.

## Ethnic Background

The ethnic makeup of Sandwell has seen extensive changes since 2001. Just under twothirds of Sandwell residents now class themselves as being of White British origin, and a further 4.1% are of Other White origin (which includes Irish and Gypsy Travellers). 30.1% of Sandwell's population are from other ethnic backgrounds. These Sandwell figures compare with England & Wales averages of 80.5%, 5.5% and 14% respectively.

With the exception of Smethwick, Sandwell towns have seen increases in the proportion of residents in all Minority Ethnic groups, and a contrasting decline in the White British group since 2001. The White British population in Oldbury town has fallen from 79.6% in 2001 to 67.6% in 2011.

Oldbury town has relatively high proportions of people of Pakistani and Mixed Ethnicity compared to the other Sandwell towns, at 3.9% and 3.8% respectively. However, the proportion of Pakistani residents is still below the borough average.

- The proportion of Bangladeshi residents in the town is also below the borough average, and at 0.5% is the second lowest of the six towns.
- Within the town, Bristnall ward has the highest proportion for the Mixed Ethnic group (4.6%) and Oldbury ward for the Pakistani community (9.8%).
- At 49.2%, Oldbury ward has a relatively high proportion of residents overall from all Minority Ethnic groups (that is, all ethnic groups other than White British). Oldbury ward ranks in the bottom six among all Sandwell wards in terms of the White British population.

## Religion 2011

In terms of religion, 55.2% of Sandwell residents are Christian, lower than the national average of 59.3%. This has fallen considerably since 2001, when 68.6% of Sandwell residents said they were Christian.

Oldbury town overall has a similar proportion of Christian residents to Sandwell, but is lower in terms of most other religious affiliations. The proportion of residents who stated they follow no religion is above the Borough average.

- At 15.8%, Oldbury ward is fourth highest of all wards in Sandwell in terms of residents who state their religion is Sikh. This ward also has a relatively high proportion of Muslims compared to the town and borough averages.
- Old Warley ranks 5th out of all Sandwell wards in terms of the proportion of Christian residents (62%, which compares with a borough average of 55.2%). This ward ranks fifth lowest for the proportion of Muslims.
- Bristnall and Langley are both above the Sandwell average in terms of the proportion of Christians (57.8% and 59.9% respectively compared with an average of 55.2%).

When considering country of birth, 84.6% of Sandwell residents were born in the United Kingdom or Ireland, compared with 87.3% nationally. One in eight Sandwell residents were born in a country outside the European Union. Oldbury town is above the Sandwell average in terms of the proportion of residents who were born in the United Kingdom, and is below average for residents born outside of the European Union.

- Old Warley ranks third in terms of the proportion of residents born in Ireland, although this only accounts for 1.2% of residents in the ward overall.
- Oldbury ward has a high proportion of residents born outside of the EU at 16.8%, this is more than double the proportions of the other wards which make up the town, and ranks sixth highest of all Sandwell wards.

The 2011 Census collected information for the first time on main language and English language skills. It should be noted that people who did not report English as a main language may be fluent English speakers. In Oldbury town, 4.4% of households have no residents who have English as a main language - below the average for the Borough.

- Oldbury ward has a relatively high proportion of households where no residents have English as a main language (7.9% compared with a town average of 4.4%).
- Old Warley has a high proportion of households where all have English as a main language (93.1%). This reflects residents' country of birth.

# Economic Status & Qualifications

## Economically Active

A resident is considered economically active if employed, self-employed, unemployed but looking for work and able to start within two weeks, or a full-time student who also has a job. Oldbury town has the greatest proportion of residents who are economically active out of the six towns (68.9%) and also the highest proportion of residents in full-time employment (39.6%). Within the town:

- Oldbury ward has the highest proportion of residents in full-time employment (41.4%), this is the second highest of all Sandwell wards.
- Old Warley has a relatively high proportion of self-employed (7.3%), the second highest of all Sandwell wards.
- Unemployment within the town is highest in Oldbury ward and lowest in Old Warley (at 5.1%, this is the lowest in the Borough).

## Economically Inactive

Oldbury town has the lowest level of economic inactivity among 16-74 year olds of the six towns (31.1%). Within this category:

- The highest proportion of retired residents (aged 16-74) are in Old Warley (15.2%), as would be expected from its' older age profile.
- Most wards in the town have a lower proportion of residents looking after the home or family than Sandwell as a whole, except for Oldbury ward which is the same as the Borough average.
- The proportion who are long-term sick or disabled is lowest in Old Warley (4.2%).

• The proportion of students is similar to the Borough average in most wards.

## Qualifications

The table shows the highest level of academic, vocational or professional qualifications obtained by residents aged 16 and over. Briefly, the categories are as follows:

- No qualifications: No formal qualifications;
- Level 1: 1-4 GCSEs or equivalent qualifications;
- Level 2: 5 GCSEs or equivalent qualifications;
- Apprenticeships;
- Level 3: 2 or more A-levels or equivalent qualifications;
- Level 4 or above: Bachelors degree or equivalent, and higher qualifications;
- Other qualifications including foreign qualifications.

Oldbury town has a slightly higher proportion of residents with the highest level qualifications, level 4 or above, than Sandwell as a whole and a lower proportion of residents with no qualifications. Within the town:

- Old Warley has the greatest proportion of highly qualified residents, 20.8% are qualified to level 4 or above.
- Bristnall has the highest proportion with no qualifications (34.9%), but this is still lower than the Borough average.

The 2011 Census asked for the first time whether any qualifications had been gained outside the UK. In Oldbury town, 5.1% of residents aged 16 and over had foreign qualifications,. Within the town, Oldbury ward had the highest proportion, at 8.3%.

# Transport

In 2011, 33.9% of Sandwell households do not have access to a car or van, which has fallen from 37.5% in 2001. Car ownership levels in Oldbury town overall are higher than the Sandwell average, with a total of 20,619 cars and vans available to households living within the town.

- 35.1% of households in Langley are without a car or van in the town, higher than both the town and borough averages.
- 46.2% of households in Oldbury ward have access to 1 car or van, the second highest of all Sandwell wards.
- 28.4% of households in Old Warley have access to 2 or more cars or vans, the fifth highest of all Sandwell wards.

# Health & Provision of Unpaid Care

In 2011, those reporting a long term health problem or disability (including those related to age) that limited their day-to-day activities and that had lasted, or was expected to last, at least 12 months, were asked to assess whether their daily activities were limited a lot, a little or not at all by such a health problem. In Oldbury town, 10.3% of residents said they were limited a little, whilst 10.5% said they were limited a lot, similar to the Sandwell average.

- Oldbury ward fairs much better on this indicator, at 9.0% and 9.2% respectively the fourth lowest of Sandwell's wards on both indicators.
- Old Warley is higher than the town average in terms of those whose daily activities are limited a little (11.5% compared with 10.3%). This will be due in part to the older age profile of this ward.

Residents were asked to assess their general state of health on a five point scale: very good, good, fair, bad or very bad. Again, Oldbury town is fairly similar to the Sandwell average on this measure.

• Oldbury ward is relatively high in terms of those stating their level of health is good or very good - at 78.7% this is third highest of the Sandwell wards.

A person is a provider of unpaid care if they look after or give help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of long-term physical or mental ill health or disability, or problems related to old age. This does not include any activities as part of paid employment. 11.6% of Oldbury town residents provide unpaid care, slightly higher than the Sandwell average.

- Of all Sandwell wards, Old Warley has the highest proportion of residents providing unpaid care (12.9%). Again, this is likely to be due to the age profile of the ward.
- Bristnall is the fourth highest of Sandwell wards in terms of residents providing unpaid care for 50 hours a week or more.

## Housing

The Census asks various questions relating to housing, including, the type of accommodation people live in, its tenure (whether the household owns or rents their accommodation), whether it has central heating and how many rooms it has. The occupancy ratings of rooms and bedrooms are indicators of deprivation and overcrowding in a household. An occupancy rating of -1 implies that there is one room too few for the number of people living in the household (shown as % overcrowded on the table).

Nationally, the census has shown an increase in private rented accommodation, a fall in owner occupation and a shift in the social rented sector from councils to other registered social landlords since 2001. Oldbury town has the highest level of owner-occupation of the six towns in the Borough. The proportion of households in privately rented accommodation has increased to 13.2%, which is similar to Sandwell as a whole. It has the lowest proportion of social rented housing of the six towns.

- Old Warley has the highest level of owner occupation, at 70.1%, this is the third highest of all Sandwell wards.
- The highest proportion of socially rented housing is in Langley (28.8%), this is the only ward in the town which is higher than the Sandwell average.
- The proportion of privately rented housing is highest in Oldbury (19.6%), this is the third highest of all Sandwell wards. Oldbury ward has seen a large increase in households renting from a private landlord or letting agency, from 313 households (6.9%) in 2001 to 1009 (18.8%) in 2011.

Vacancy rates in the town are similar to that for Sandwell as a whole. The proportion of detached and terraced housing are both lower than the Borough average. Within the town:

• Oldbury ward has the highest vacancy rate (5.1%), and highest proportion of detached housing (13.3.%), Langley has the highest proportion of terraced housing (25.8%).

In Oldbury town, the proportion of households lacking central heating is similar to the Borough average and overcrowding is slightly lower.

 Oldbury ward has a higher than average proportion of overcrowded households (10.7%), meaning 1 in 10 households have an occupancy rating of -1 or less.
